




Orientation Guide

Hotel Check-in: Friday, July 18

Conference Attire: Smart Casual


- A smart casual wardrobe should include comfortable and versatile clothing that will give you a professional appearance without wearing suits or other formal professional clothing.



Their debut feature documentary, Red Without Blue, won the Audience Award at Slamdance and the Jury Award at Frameline before airing on the Sundance Channel, PBS, and Netflix. They later co-produced and edited Framing Agnes, which premiered at Sundance where it won both the NEXT Innovator and Audience Awards, and was named one of The New Yorker's Best Films of the Year. Brooke has directed numerous award-winning narrative shorts, with honors from festivals including Palm Springs ShortsFest and the Florida Film Festival. Brooke is the creator and host of I Changed My Mind, an interview series about intellectual humility and personal transformation. Produced in partnership with The Greater Good Science Center and PFLAG, the series has received both an Anthem Award for Social Impact and a Communicator Award of Excellence. Brooke has also edited over 200 episodes of the Emmy-nominated PBS series Brief But Spectacular. As a faculty member at the Archer School for Girls, they mentor the next generation of filmmakers while continuing to craft stories that bridge divides and spark dialogue.
